During the Siachen Conflict of June 1987, the 8th Jammu & Kashmir Light Infantry was deployed to the Siachen Glacier area. It was then found that a large number of Pakistani infiltrators had intruded into the Siachen Glacier. The peak which he captured was renamed Bana Top in his honour.



August 14th was a memorable celebration with the tiny tots understanding the importance of Independence Day through speeches, songs, and drama. The program started with our esteemed guest Shri Captain Bana Singh lighting the lamp. This was followed by the student anchors inviting students to present dance drama and songs.
