Van Mahotsav Week 1st - 7th July

Van Mahotsav is an important occasion to raise awareness about the benefits of trees and to encourage people to become more active in environmental conservation efforts. At school, Van Mahotsav week is observed in the first week of July and all the students from LKG to UKG are made aware of the need to conserve the environment.

Van Mahotsav week included assembly programs in which students and teachers presented, speeches, songs, skits, dances, puzzles, and riddles creating awareness and the benefits of saving trees.

All the classes also had competitions related to Van Mahotsav. They were Class LKG and UKG participated in a colouring activity. They were at their creative best, tracing and colouring very neatly the tree pictures.

Class I learned about flowers by creating impressions of flowers using paints. Seeing blue trees, red trees, and wheel patterns of flowers was wonderful.

Class II – learned about the trees in our school and their names by tracing the leaves on paper using crayons

Class III- conducted a flower study where they counted the number of petals in the flower, wrote the name, identified the smell, drew the shape, and coloured it.

Class – IV did a plant study where they studied the traditional medicinal plants, and identified any two medicinal plants exhibited, with their name, fragrance, colour of the leaf, and uses.

Class V – recited a poem about trees, where they learned how trees are an important part of nature.

Class VI- participated in a blindfold written test, where teachers and students used their senses of touch and smell to recognise the fruits, flowers, and leaves. It was a wonderful game and students thoroughly enjoyed and learned too.

Class – VII participated in a fruit study where they had to identify fruits with their scientific name and local name and share if there is any myth or folk tale associated with it.

Class – VIII participated in a Flower study, 2 flowers were exhibited and students had to identify the flowers with their shape, fragrance, utility, and season. Students were also encouraged to share any local myth associated with the chosen flower.

Class IX appeared for a GK test to check their knowledge in trees flowers, animals, and birds of India.

Class X appeared for a written test in National Parks of India and World Heritage Sites.

The educational goal was to create

- Environmental Awareness and the role of trees in the ecosystem, including how they produce oxygen, store carbon, and support wildlife.
- The importance of conserving various species and habitats.
- how planting and preserving trees can help combat global warming.
